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Key points for disposing of household garbage

1 Please follow local rules and put out your garbage by 8:30 AM on the designated day.

Garbage collection days are determined by the garbage sorting category and your area. Please check the garbage collection calendar for collection days. Garbage put out after collection has finished will not be collected.

2 Put your garbage out at the designated location.

Garbage collection locations are determined by your area. If you are unsure, ask a local resident or the manager of your apartment complex.

3 Sort your garbage properly.

Disposal methods vary depending on the type of garbage. Recyclable garbage should be disposed of as recyclable garbage.

• Garbage bags designated by the Nantan Clean Center Regional Administrative Affairs Association (Yabu City and Asago City)

Burnable garbage must be placed in designated garbage bags.

Non-burnable garbage must not be placed in designated garbage bags.

*Designated garbage bags are sold at supermarkets, home improvement stores, drugstores, convenience stores, and independent shops.

About Waste Reduction and Recycling Promotion Initiatives

The key word for waste reduction, **3R**, stands for:

Promoting the **3R** and working to realize a circular economy that minimizes environmental impact is an important issue. Please use the revised Household Garbage Sorting and Recycling Guide to promote waste reduction and recycling.



Major Revisions

① Plastic Products Now **Recyclable Garbage**

Even though plastic products are made of the same plastic material, plastic containers and packaging were previously collected as recyclable waste, while plastic products were classified as burnable waste. To further promote resource recycling, the Act on Promotion of Resource Recycling for Plastics requires that plastic products be collected separately as recyclable waste.

② Products containing lithium-ion batteries are classified as **hazardous waste**.

Due to the increasing number of products containing lithium-ion batteries and the increasing number of fires caused by lithium-ion batteries at waste disposal sites and collection trucks nationwide, the waste classification for products containing lithium-ion batteries has been changed from non-burnable garbage to hazardous waste and they are to be collected separately.

Burnable garbage

Disposal Procedure

- (1) Place garbage in designated garbage bags.
- (2) Put garbage out in the morning of the collection day. Do not put garbage out the day before. Garbage odors can be a nuisance to those around the garbage station. Small animals such as crows may tear the bag and scatter the garbage. This will make the garbage station dirty and unsanitary.
- (3) It should be possible to hold each garbage bag in one hand. Overfilling the bag may result in spillage or small animals grabbing the garbage and scattering it. This could also injure collection staff. Securely tie the top of the bag before disposal. Do not use tape.
- (4) Oversized garbage that does not fit into the designated garbage bags should be disposed of as oversized garbage. However, if an item can be safely disassembled or cut into pieces so it fits into the designated garbage bags, the item can be disposed of as burnable garbage.
- (5) Please cut futons, blankets, curtains, hoses, ropes, etc. into lengths less than 1 meter before disposal. This is to prevent them from getting caught in machinery. If they cannot be safely cut, please dispose of them as oversized garbage.
- (6) Thoroughly drain water from food waste before taking it to the garbage station.
- (7) Before disposing of cooking oil, soak it into paper or cloth or allow it to harden.
- (8) Do not dispose of PET bottles, plastics (plastic containers and packaging/plastic products), paper containers and packaging, or waste paper as burnable garbage. Please separate them and dispose of them as recyclable garbage.
- (9) Garbage other than burnable garbage must not be placed in designated garbage bags.

Items that cannot be collected (items that cannot be disposed of):

- ✗ Garbage placed in bags other than designated garbage bags.
- ✗ Garbage with designated garbage bags taped shut.
- ✗ Garbage that does not fit into designated garbage bags.



Recyclable garbage must not be disposed of as burnable garbage. Please dispose of it as recyclable garbage.

Non-burnable garbage

Please place in the collection basket at the collection site.

- ① Glassware (cups, mirrors, etc.)
- ② Metal items (pots, kettles, etc.)
- ③ Ceramics (bowls, teacups, etc.)

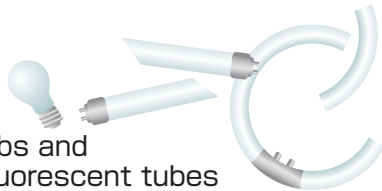

Small appliances

● Disposal Procedure

- (1) Please do not put these items in a bag. Instead, put them in the collection basket.
- (2) Remove batteries. (Dry-cell batteries, button batteries, lithium-ion batteries, etc. should be disposed of as hazardous waste.)
- (3) Place sharp objects in a clear bag so that the contents can be seen.
- (4) For safety and to prevent scattering, place broken fluorescent tubes, glassware, and ceramics in a clear bag so that the contents can be seen.
- (5) Dispose of candy cans and powdered milk cans over 1 liter as non-burnable garbage.
- (6) Items larger than 50cm x 50cm x 100cm should be disposed of as oversized garbage. Items that can be safely disassembled or cut into pieces and fit within 50cm x 50cm x 100cm can be disposed of as non-burnable garbage.

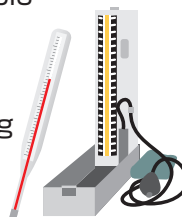

●Disposal Procedure

- (1) Please separate and dispose of the following items: Spray cans and gas cartridges, kerosene stoves and fan heaters, disposable lighters, dry-cell batteries, mercury-containing products, fluorescent light bulbs, lithium-ion batteries, mobile batteries, and products with built-in lithium-ion batteries, etc. Please remove caps and nozzles.
- (2) Empty the contents of spray cans and gas cartridges and dispose of them without puncturing them. If you are unable to use up the contents, please contact the Nantan Clean Center.
- (3) Kerosene in kerosene stoves and kerosene fan heaters should be burned completely, and if they contain batteries, remove them before disposing of them.
- (4) Disposable lighters should be used up completely before disposal.
- (5) Leaking or rusty batteries should be placed in a clear plastic bag.
- (6) Dry batteries, lithium-ion batteries, products with built-in lithium-ion batteries, and mobile batteries should all be disposed of in one collection basket, separated from other hazardous waste. For disposal instructions, please see the next page (p. 7).

Items that cannot be collected (items that cannot be disposed of):

- ✗ Spray cans with contents still inside
- ✗ Products with built-in lithium-ion batteries, etc., exceeding 50cm x 50cm x 100cm in size ➡ Oversized garbage (charged) (p. 8)

Disposal Method (Choose one of the following disposal methods: ①-③)

- Lithium-ion batteries
- Products containing lithium-ion batteries
- Mobile batteries

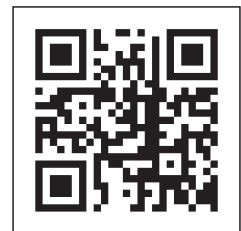
① Notes on Disposal as Hazardous waste

- (1) Lithium-ion batteries should be discharged (inserted into the device and used until fully depleted), insulated (apply insulating tape to the metal terminals), and then placed in a clear plastic bag for disposal.
- (2) If the lithium-ion battery can be easily removed by hand from a product containing a built-in lithium-ion battery, be sure to remove it and dispose of the lithium-ion battery alone as hazardous waste. If the dimensions of the removed product are less than 50cm x 50cm x 100cm, dispose of it as non-burnable garbage. If the dimensions are greater than 50cm x 50cm x 100cm, dispose of it as oversized garbage (charged).
- (3) Lithium-ion batteries removed from devices should be treated as described in (1) above.
- (4) If the lithium-ion battery cannot be easily removed by hand from a product containing it, dispose of it as hazardous waste. If the product's dimensions exceed 50cm x 50cm x 100cm, dispose of it as oversized garbage (charged).
- (5) Dispose of the blade portion of an electric shaver as non-burnable garbage.
- (6) Dispose of the brush portion of an electric toothbrush as burnable garbage.
- (7) Mobile batteries are to be collected as is. Do not dispose of them as is without disassembling them.
- (8) Swollen or deformed lithium-ion batteries, mobile batteries, etc. may emit smoke or catch fire, so be sure to consult the Nantan Clean Center. Do not dispose of them as hazardous waste.

② Notes on disposing of batteries at JBRC recycling partner stores

- (1) The battery must be manufactured by a JBRC member company.
- (2) The battery must be a lithium-ion battery, nickel-cadmium battery, or nickel-metal hydride battery.
- (3) The battery must not be damaged, leaking, swollen, or otherwise abnormal. It must not be a laminated battery without a case.

③ Notes on how to dispose of batteries at an electronics retailer

- (1) The battery must be a lithium-ion battery, nickel-cadmium battery, or nickel-metal hydride battery.
- (2) The battery must not be damaged, leaking, swollen, or otherwise abnormal.
- (3) For details, ask an electronics retailer.

Oversized garbage [charged]

Oversized Garbage:

Burnable items are items that are too large to fit into designated garbage bags (long items such as water hoses and ropes are over 1 meter), while non-burnable items are items that exceed 50cm x 50cm x 100cm.

● Items that are too large to fit into designated garbage bags (large bag: 65cm wide x 85cm long) ● Long items such as water hoses and ropes that are over 1 meter in length (to prevent them from getting wrapped around the sorting machine) ※ Items must be safely disassembled and cut into pieces that fit into designated bags (long items such as water hoses and ropes are under 1 meter), and then disposed of as burnable garbage.		● Non-burnable Garbage items with dimensions exceeding 50cm x 50cm x 100cm. ※ Items can be disposed of as non-burnable garbage if safely disassembled and cut into pieces no larger than 50cm x 50cm x 100cm.

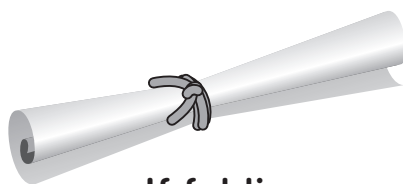


- Please be careful when disposing of long items (futons, carpets, curtains, blankets, rugs, water hoses, ropes, etc.).



If folding

If folding, tie in a bundle using string to a size of no more than 100cm x 70cm x 40cm. Do not mix futons with clothing, etc.



If folding is not possible

If folding is not possible, roll each item up and tie with string.



Long items such as water hoses and ropes

(To prevent them from getting wrapped in the sorting machine) Cut to lengths less than 1m and dispose of as burnable garbage. If cutting is not possible, roll and tie the items together before disposing of them.

Oversized garbage (planned collection) [charged]

●Disposal Procedure (Purchase and Attach Oversized Garbage Designation Stickers)

- (1) Purchase the required number of Oversized Garbage Designation Stickers (one for each item).
(Oversized Garbage Designation Stickers are sold at retail stores throughout the city.)
- (2) Write the item name and your name on the sticker, attach the required number of stickers in a visible location, or tie them with string and dispose of them in the designated area on the day for oversized garbage collection.

Electric beds and heavy, special oversized garbage are not subject to oversized garbage collection (planned/door-to-door). Please take them directly to the Nantan Clean Center.

Items that require particular effort to dispose of (items that should be disposed of by a professional when purchasing a new item).		¥900 (3 stickers)	Spring mattresses, beds (excluding cribs), sofas seating three or more, chair-type electric massagers, tatami mats, etc.
Particularly large items.	Items with a total height, width, and depth of 3 m or more.	¥600 (2 stickers)	Furniture, shoe cabinets, cupboards, steel storage shelves, dressers, bookshelves, lockers, etc.
Items other than those listed above.	Items with a total height, width, and depth of less than 3m.	¥300 (1 stickers)	

※If safely disassembling and cutting oversized garbage, each bundle must contain only one item of the same type. Particularly large items (¥600) can be safely disassembled and cut into items other than the items listed above (¥300).

If you will take oversized garbage directly to the Nantan Clean Center, please do not affix an oversized garbage designation sticker.

Oversized garbage (door-to-door collection) **[charged]**

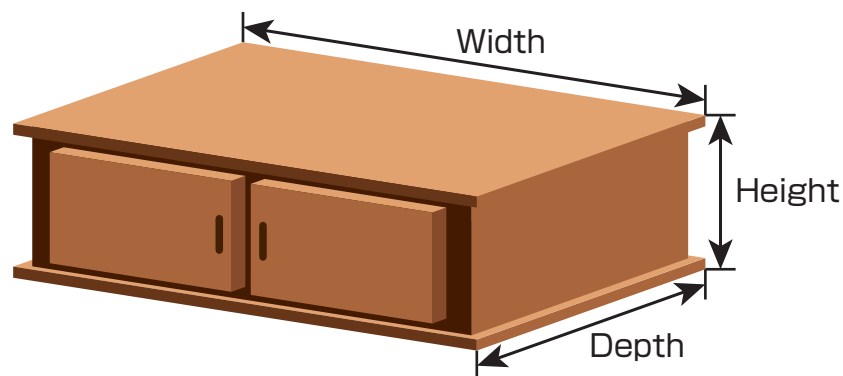
●Door-to-Door Collection Procedure

**Please do not affix
an oversized garbage designation sticker.
Please pay the fee at the time of collection.**

Oversized garbage is collected door-to-door once a month. We will collect from an outdoor location, such as your home or parking lot, as agreed upon at the time of reservation. We will not enter your home. In addition to the fee based on the item and size of the oversized garbage (¥300, ¥600, or ¥900 per item), there is a separate collection and transportation fee of ¥1,200 per item.

- (1) Measure the size (height, width, and depth) of the garbage you wish to dispose of.
- (2) Call the Nantan Clean Center (079-670-3366).
- (3) Tell us the item and size. We will inform you of the fee.
- (4) Confirm the collection date and collection location (where to drop off).
- (5) On the collection day, please place your oversized garbage at the agreed location, be present for collection, and pay the fee in cash.
- (6) If you are not at home, collection will not be possible. We will leave a notice in your mailbox and cancel your collection reservation. If you would like collection after that, you will need to apply again.

※Only oversized garbage for which a request has been made by phone can be collected.

● Disposal Procedure

- (1) Remove any remaining contents and rinse dirty cans with water before disposal. Items with food residue or stains that cannot be removed should be disposed of as non-burnable garbage.
- (2) Place them loose in the collection basket (do not place them in a bag).
- (3) There is no need to separate steel cans and aluminum cans.
- (4) Size is limited to items 1L or less. Cans over 1L should be disposed of as non-burnable garbage.
- (5) Dispose of cooking oil cans as non-burnable garbage.

Items that cannot be collected (items that cannot be disposed of)

- ✗ Cooking oil cans, 18L cans, and cans over 1L
Items that are heavily soiled or rusted
→ Non-burnable garbage (P5)
- ✗ Spray cans and gas cartridges
→ Hazardous waste (P6)

●Disposal Procedure

- (1) Remove any remaining contents, remove caps, crown caps, corks, etc., and be sure to rinse the inside with water.
- (2) Separate bottles into colorless, transparent, brown, and other colors and place them loose (do not put in bags) in separate collection baskets.
- (3) Please have returnable bottles such as beer bottles and 1.8L bottles collected by a liquor store or other retailer whenever possible.

- ✗ Cooking oil bottles

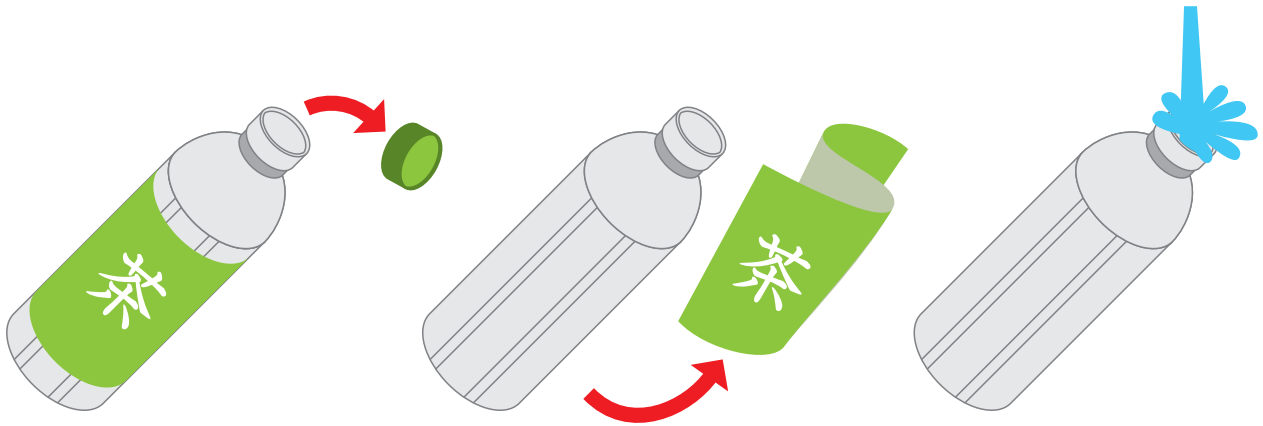

- (2) Be sure to rinse the inside with water and drain the water before disposal.

- (3) Place them loose (not in a bag) in a PET bottle collection container (foldable box).

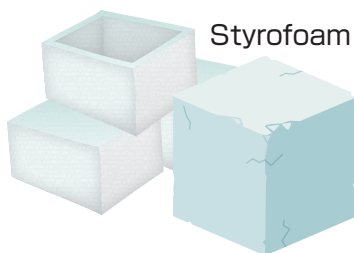

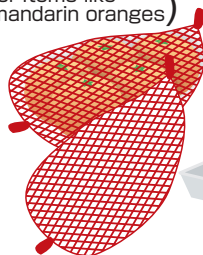

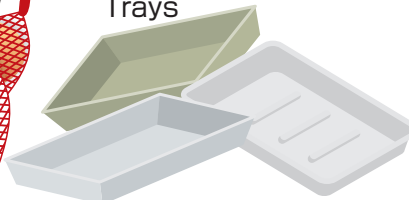

● Disposal Instructions

- (1) Do not separate plastic containers and packaging from other plastic products. Put them in the plastic collection container (foldable box) loose (not in a bag).
 - (2) Dispose of items only after using up all of the contents. Soiled containers and packaging cannot be recycled. Items with food or other contents on them should be lightly rinsed with water and disposed of only after the dirt is removed.
 - (3) If the dirt cannot be removed, dispose of them as burnable garbage.
 - (4) There is no need to remove price labels or stickers from the back of food trays or plastic wrap. (if it peels off easily, please remove it.)
- ※ Please use designated collection points for trays and egg cartons whenever possible.

Items that cannot be collected (items that cannot be disposed of):

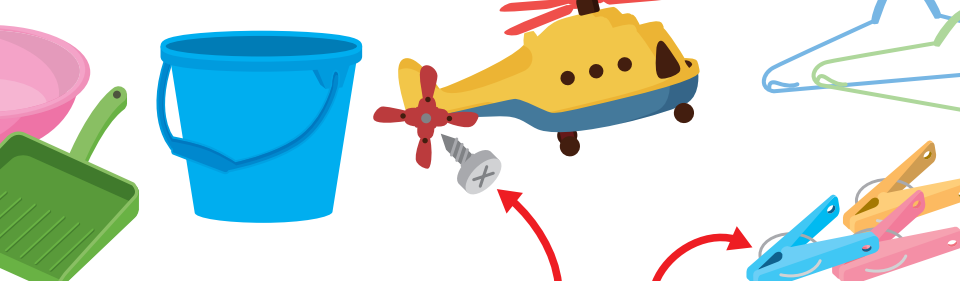
- ✗ Leftover food, food waste, items with soil or sand still attached, or items that cannot be cleaned
→ Burnable garbage (P4)
- ✗ Cooking oil bottles → Burnable garbage (P4)



Items that can be collected (items that can be disposed of)

※"All" means 100% plastic material. Mostly of means items that have metal (screws, springs) attached to only a small portion of the product, such as plastic clothespins. Remove any parts that can be easily removed by hand to make the item 100% plastic material.

● Items with a side length of less than 50 cm.



Remove any metal parts (screws, springs) that can be easily removed by hand.

Plastic products should be disposed of loosely (not in bags) in a collection container (foldable box) at a designated facility, without separating them from plastic containers and packaging. Collections are made once a week on collection days.

Items with food scraps, food waste, soil, etc. attached, or items that cannot be cleaned, should be disposed of as burnable garbage.

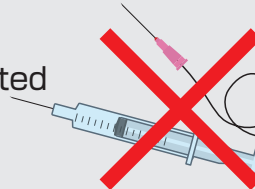
× Items with a side length of 50 cm or more

× Items that may cause fires, such as used small electronic devices or devices that use lithium-ion batteries (Examples) Electric toys, heat-not-burn tobacco products, handheld fans, game consoles, lighters, etc.



⇒ Hazardous waste

× Items that contain or are likely to contain pathogens that can infect or be transmitted to humans (Examples) IV equipment (excluding infusion packs), needles, syringes, etc.



⇒ Return to medical institution

× Items that pose a risk of injury to workers (Examples) Cutters, knives, kitchen slicers, safety razors, etc., items where plastic and blades are crimped together



⇒ Non-burnable garbage

× Items that will affect recycling facilities (Examples) Thick items such as cutting boards and imitation wood. (Thickness: Approximately 5mm or more) Carbon fiber-reinforced items such as rackets and golf club shafts, beer crates, cooler boxes, hose reels, plastic containers, etc.

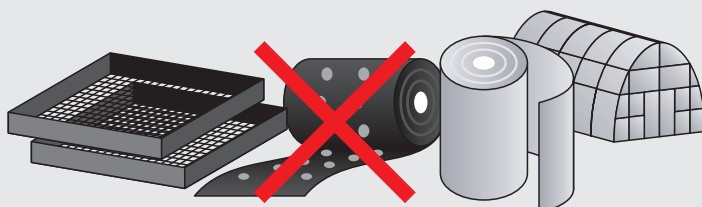


× Items that are difficult to recycle (items made of multiple materials such as fiber and synthetic rubber) (Examples: shoes, boots, sneakers, slippers, bags, handbags, pouches, etc.)



⇒ Burnable garbage

× Agricultural waste plastic (Rice seedling trays, mulch sheets, furrow cover plastic sheets, vinyl used in greenhouse ceilings, etc.)



× Plastic bottles



Paper containers and packaging

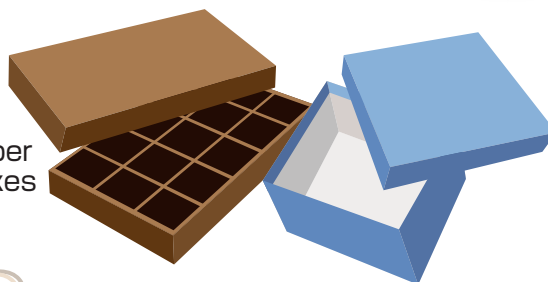

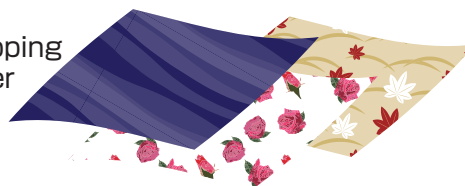

● Disposal Procedure

- (1) Separate and dispose of items with the paper container and packaging identification mark.
 - (2) Dispose of items only after using up all of the contents. Dirty containers and packaging cannot be recycled. If food or other contents remain, rinse it lightly with water. If the stain cannot be removed, dispose of it as burnable garbage.
 - (3) Dispose of items as is in the paper container and packaging collection container (foldable box) without placing them in a bag.
 - (4) Items with the "Paper Carton Mark," such as milk and juice cartons, can also be disposed of with paper container and packaging collection. However, if there is plastic attached to the spout, please remove it.
- ※ Please remove the plastic spout even if it is marked for recycling with the plastic spout on. Please use stores and organizations that collect paper packs exclusively as much as possible.

●Disposal Instructions

- (1) Sort newspapers (including inserts), magazines, and cardboard by type and tie them in a bundle.
 - (2) Remove any foreign objects, such as files and albums, including metal products and plastic clips.
 - (3) All paper other than newspapers, cardboard, and paper containers and packaging (excluding (4)) should be sorted as magazines.
 - (4) Dispose of vinyl-coated paper, carbonless paper, thermal paper, and waterproof paper as burnable garbage.
 - (5) In Yabu City and Asago City, we encourage collective collection by each district, school PTA, etc. Please put out your garbage for collective collection whenever possible.
- ※When putting out garbage for collective collection, please follow the rules of your local area (school district).

⚠ Items that cannot be collected (items that cannot be disposed of):

⚠ Four types of home appliances: televisions, air conditioners, washing machines/ clothes dryers, refrigerators/freezers

If you wish to dispose of a television, air conditioner, washing machine/clothes dryer, or refrigerator/freezer, please pay a recycling fee and have it taken away. (A collection and transportation fee may apply.)

[Disposal Method]

(Choose one of the following three disposal methods.)

① Ask the retailer (home appliance retailer).

Ask the store where you purchased the product (the store where you will purchase a new product) to take it away. Or, inquire and then take it in.

② Ask a participating store registered with the Hyogo Prefecture Electrical Commercial Association.

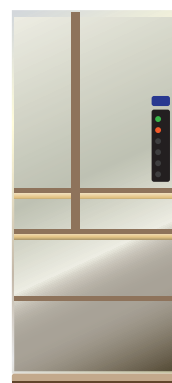
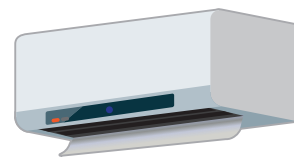
③ Take it to a designated collection point.

Obtain an appliance recycling ticket from the post office, fill out the necessary information on the ticket, and pay the fee. Then, take the discarded appliance to the following designated collection point.
